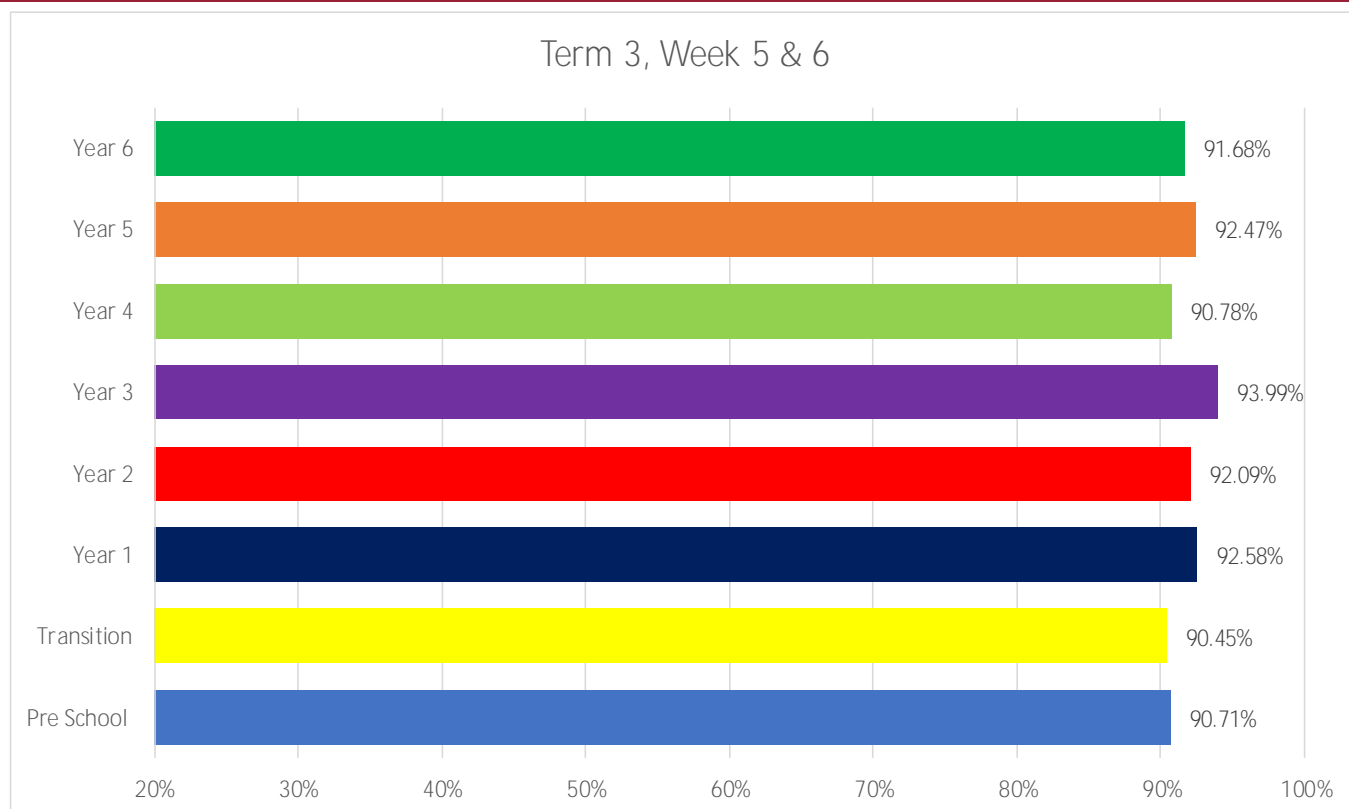

Curriculum Spotlight: Mathematics

Currently in Year 1, students are developing their ability to solve simple subtraction problems. They have been learning to use a range of strategies including counting up, partitioning and the use of a number line. Students are also learning how to collect data using tally marks and how to represent data using objects and drawings. Students in Year 1 have enjoyed categorising sea animal pictures, placing that data into a graph and answering questions about the results .



Dice Games!

Dice are cheap, readily available and a versatile resource that can be used to develop a wide range of mathematical ideas and skills including mental computation, place value and chance processes. Dice games can be played quietly or noisily, with one child or two kids or a even a crowd! Dice games are versatile, educational, portable, help teach social skills such as taking turns and winning and losing gracefully. Dice games are also lots of fun!

See if you can try some these ideas at home:

Create a number sentence using the 2 numbers on your dice: $6 + 3 = 9$ • Dice and dominoes: Roll 2 dice. Match the 2 numbers on the dice to a domino. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Multiplication: Work with a partner or a few members in your family. Roll 2 dice. The values shown on the top of each dice are multiplied. Write down the answer. Each player rolls 5 times. The person with the highest total after 5 rolls is the winner. • Mental strategies and critical thinking: Players take turns to roll 2 dice. Add or multiply the dice to produce a score. Each player takes a turn rolling all of the dice and creating the largest number possible. The player with the highest number is the winner. Variations: Create the smallest number possible. Play a few rounds then add up all of your numbers! • Multiplying by 10 or 100 and adding numbers: The dice is rolled 10 times. After each roll players needs to decide whether to multiply the number by 10 or multiply the number by 100.
