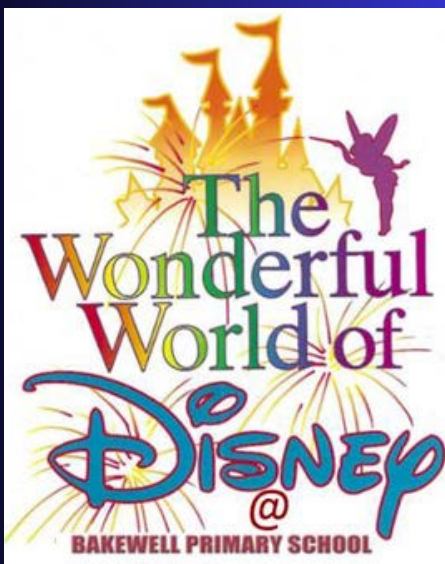

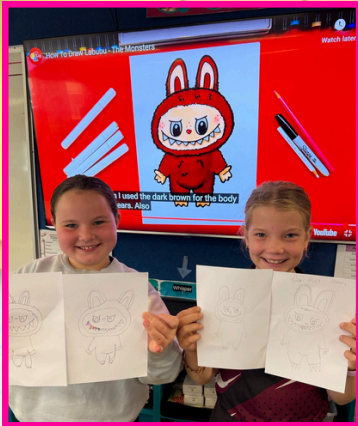

NTLC Student Leaders Launch Drawing Club

We are excited to share a wonderful new initiative from our NTLC student leaders to support student wellbeing and safety during playtime—Drawing Club!

Open to all students in Years 3–6, Drawing Club provides a calm, creative, and welcoming space during recess. Students can choose from How to Draw tutorials, colouring sheets, or bring their own ideas for free drawing. The tutorials are scheduled in advance so students can plan their visits, and each class will receive a laminated poster with the timetable. Drawing Club is held in C9 (Ms Hodgson's classroom) every Tuesday and Friday at recess, supervised by the NTLC teacher leader.

Since launching in Week 6 of Term 3, the club has had a fantastic turnout. Students, teachers, and families have already shared wonderful feedback about the positive impact it is having. Many students are enjoying having a safe, structured, and fun option during playtime.

This initiative is a direct response to our 2024 School Survey, which showed that only 58% of students felt safe at school. With a target of 75% by 2025, our NTLC leaders are working hard to create inclusive opportunities that help everyone feel safe and supported. Their own Safe at School Survey highlighted the need for more safe and inclusive playtime spaces—Drawing Club is one powerful step toward meeting this goal.

We encourage all Year 3–6 students who enjoy drawing, or who would benefit from a quieter playtime option, to come along and join in.



On Tuesday 2nd September, Bakewell students kicked off a stellar performance at the AFL Interschool Sport Day at Driver Primary School.
