Dear Parents & Carers,

Welcome to Week 3. We are certainly 'in the groove' in terms of teaching and learning and our students have been engaging beautifully in the lessons. Each class has been doing their 'Bounce back to Bakewell' lessons so that all our students are reminded of the high expectations around behaviour and learning that we hold.

This week we are introducing a new space within our school. Called the '**Quiet Courtyard**' it is an area for those students to go to that are looking for a quieter space to spend their breaks. Within the area there will be quiet activities such as board games and drawing for students to do. It is also a nice area for those students who are feeling a bit lonely to connect with others through games or other activities. Our SVPC and SLC students will help in the area to ensure that everybody feels included. Loud games and running will be encouraged to another area.

Each year schools must develop an Annual School Improvement Plan (ASIP). Bakewell developed our plan at the end of last year after strong consultation with our School Board, our teachers, staff and our students. The Department of Education has a number of 'Signature Strategies' for schools to choose from and our school decided on two for 2021. The first is '**Personalised Learning**' and the second is '**Triangulation of Data**'.

Over the coming newsletters I will explain what each of these entail. This week we will focus on 'Personalised Learning'.

### Personalised Learning – what is it?

Personalised Learning refers to the method teachers use to extend the knowledge and skills of their students, regardless of where

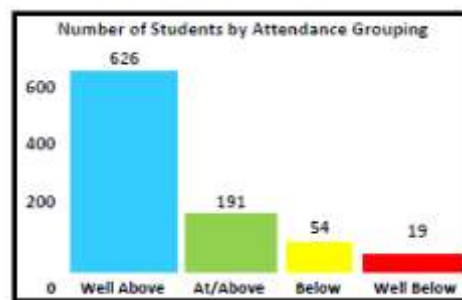
individual students are in terms of starting points. Using personalised learning means that teachers provide appropriate challenges for all students in their class. Teachers do this by responding to the student's level of readiness for learning, their interests and identifying what strategies will work best. Teachers adjust learning where needed (this includes extending the learning) and create learning opportunities to ensure that all students are supported and have opportunity for success. Teachers use strong assessment strategies to monitor their students learning and growth.

### How effective is it?

This is a very effective strategy that research evidence shows gets great results. It aligns with our Bakewell mantra of 'Positive Relationships and High Expectations' as we work with students to ensure great learning is occurring.

### School Attendance

Our school attendance is sitting at **94.8%** for the year to date. Below you will find a graph which shows how our attendance is distributed. Attendance for success (both academic and social) is essential.

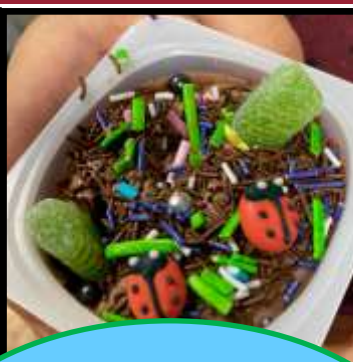

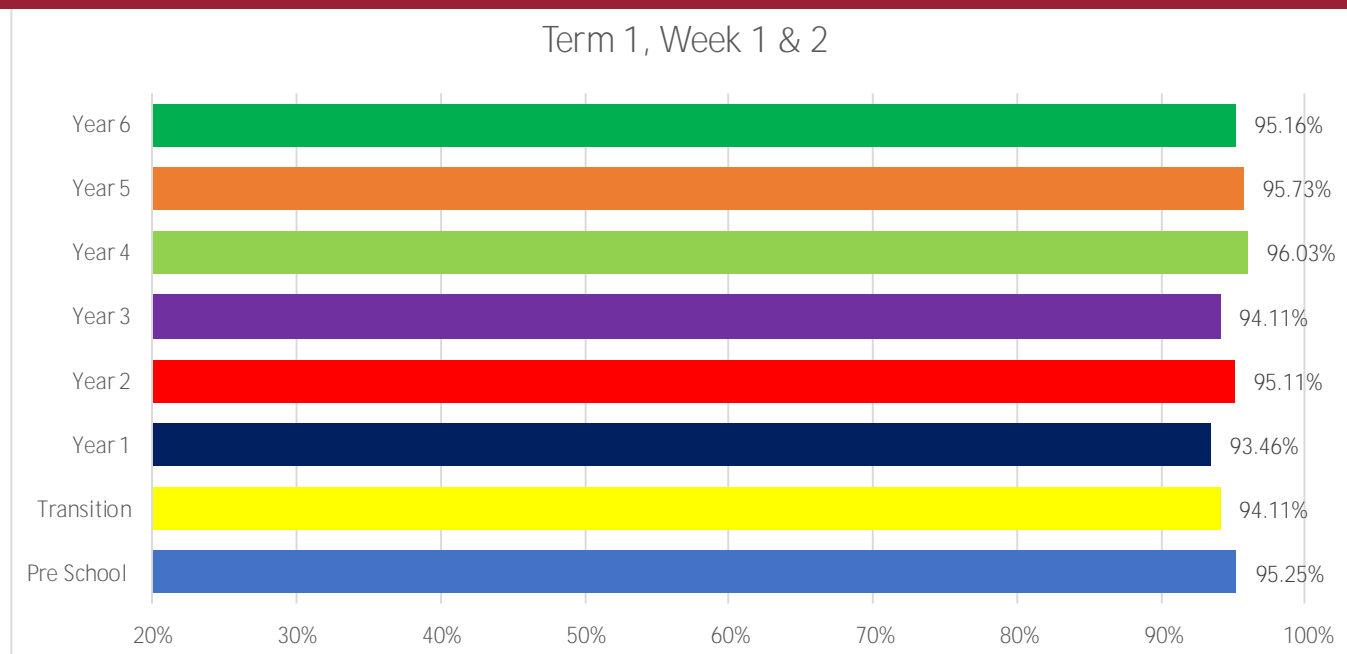
