Annual School Improvement Plan Update

Last newsletter I outlined our school's Signature Strategy of Personalised Learning from our 2021 Annual School Improvement Plan. This week I am looking at our other Signature Strategy of 'Triangulation of Data'.


What is it? – Triangulation of Data

Knowing how to triangulate data is an essential part of a teacher's toolkit for great learning to happen. It involves working with different sets of data (e.g. NAPLAN, A-E grades, other diagnostic testing and evidence of learning) and analysing those different sets of data together to inform their 'next steps' for individual students and their class as a whole. Our school executive team use the same process at a whole school level and a year level to help us decide what our next steps are as a school. Why do we do this? No one set of data can give us all the answers we need to support our students and target our teaching at the right level so all of our students can achieve.

How effective is it?

The understanding and use of Triangulation of Data is very effective. Using this tool gives teachers a clear understanding of their students and often affirms what they know from their interactions with students in their class. At Bakewell we also have regular data conversations between our teachers, their team leaders and our executive team. These conversations are great starting points for us all to share our professional knowledge and learn from each other as well as have a solid overview of how learning is going in our school.

In Term 1, the focus will be on organisation, personal strengths, goal setting and help-seeking. 


